All persons wishing to make public comment must fill out a goldenrod Public Comment Form and submit it to the Secretary of the Board. Public comment is generally limited to two (2) minutes per speaker and the total time available for public comment may be limited at the discretion of the Chair. Persons whose speech is impaired such that they are unable to address the Membership at a normal rate of speed may request an accommodation of a limited amount of additional time from the Chair but only by checking the appropriate box on the Public Comment Form. Granting such an accommodation is at the discretion of the Chair. The Membership will not and cannot respond during the meeting to matters raised under general public comment. Pursuant to provisions of the Brown Act governing these proceedings, no discussion or action may be taken on these matters unless they are listed on the agenda, or unless certain emergency or special circumstances exist. However, the Membership may direct staff to investigate and/or schedule certain matters for consideration at an Annual Membership Meeting and the staff may respond to all public comments in writing prior to the next Annual Membership Meeting.

#### ISSUES:

The Access Services bylaws [Art.VI D] require the establishment of Nominating Committees at the Annual Membership Meeting in order to develop a list of candidates for the Municipal and Local Fixed Route Transit Operators' Board Member elections.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

- 1) Appoint Joyce Rooney from Foothill Transit to the Nominating Committee for the selection of two Directors to represent the Municipal Fixed Route Operators.
- 2) Appoint Sebastian Hernandez from the city of Pasadena to the Nominating Committee for the selection of one Director to represent the Local Fixed Route Operators.
- 3) Allow additional members to volunteer until December 31, 2024.

#### BACKGROUND:

The Access Services bylaws stipulate that nominating committees be established at the Annual Membership Meeting. The committees' responsibilities include: a) sending out a letter to their member agencies publicizing the Board opening and asking members to nominate Board candidates; and b) presenting a list of candidates to the member agencies to vote on. A list of all qualified nominees will be distributed to the member representatives in March of next year for election of Directors before July 1, 2025.

To be qualified to be a Director appointed by the Municipal Fixed Route Operators or the Local Fixed Route Operators, the nominee must be a governing board member or staff person of a Municipal Fixed Route Operator or Local Fixed Route Operator, as the case may be. The current terms of office for the Directors representing the Los Angeles County Municipal and Local Fixed Route Operators end on June 30, 2025. The new term begins July 1, 2025 and ends June 30, 2027. The Municipal Operators will hold the rotating seat on the Board until June 30, 2027.
