Executive Director's Report

The main component (over 90 percent) of Access' operating budget is providing trips to our customers. In order to budget for this, Access uses a paratransit ridership forecast provided by an independent third-party consulting firm, Hollingsworth Consulting.

The paratransit demand analysis uses historical data and other variables to form the basis for the ridership forecast. Total forecasted passengers, including Access customers, personal care assistants and guests, are then converted to trips. Access' contractors are then paid on a per-trip basis.

Hollingsworth is projecting ridership to increase to more than 4.8 million passengers, which would be close to prepandemic annual ridership. This would be about a 15 percent increase over anticipated actual FY 24 ridership.

I will provide additional detail on the FY25 budget in the next issue of Behind the Scenes. Our budget will be heard by the Metro Board on June 20th and June 27th and the Access Board of Directors on June 24th.

In addition, for the first time, Access partnered with the American Planning Association (APA) to offer course credits, marking a significant milestone in our commitment to enhance professional skills and continuous learning opportunities for everyone.
