Antelope Valley Region General Manager takes a balanced approach to success

The Antelope Valley Region of Access's sprawling service area is both literally and figuratively far removed from the majority of Los Angeles County. It is behind a mountain range from the San Fernando Valley, which itself is distant from Downtown Los Angeles. The high desert of Lancaster and Palmdale is where Victor Garate and his Transdev team work tirelessly to provide "reliable and innovative [transportation] solutions that serve the common good," as the company's mission statement promises.



Operations can be a challenge, as the Antelope Valley has the greatest variety of weather-related events in the entire Access service area. Snow, ice, sandstorms, fierce winds, intense heat and floods all impact the region. Preparedness is a significant priority to ensure that the team and its fleet of accessible vehicles are ready for whatever may come. "We get all the

seasons," Garate explained. It is a different world from East Los Angeles, where Garate grew up as part of a family of six.

Garate, who is the General Manager of the Antelope Valley service region, has always been interested in helping. He taught children for a time in East Los Angeles and once aspired to be a teacher full time. He has two children with disabilities himself, so he understands why Access is important for the community. "We all might need paratransit one day," he explained.

Garate has been deeply involved in paratransit and the disability community for a long time now. He served on the Long Beach Citizen's Advisory Commission on Disabilities and worked for Global Paratransit in a wide variety of roles before taking on the General Manager position in the Antelope Valley with Transdev. He works to deliver the "best service possible" with "safety and reliability" at the forefront. He uses a balanced management approach, giving people the space and opportunity to shine while providing needed managerial support. Operational performance for the last full quarter has been solid, with the

contractor meeting every single key performance indicator that is used to measure service quality, including an impressively low complaint rate of 1.1 complaints per 1,000 trips as well as 94.4% on time performance.

When it comes to the Antelope Valley, it is advantageous to have a local resident serve as General Manager, given its comparative isolation from the rest of Los Angeles County. Garate lives in the area, giving him a good perspective on the needs of the community and the unique challenges of the region which helps him and his team continue to provide great service for Access customers of the Antelope Valley.
