Note: Access Transportation Professionals Advisory Committee meetings are held pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act [Cal. Gov. Code §54950] and are open to the public. The public may view and obtain all written information supporting this agenda provided to the committee both initially and supplementary prior to the meeting at the agency's offices located at 3449 Santa Anita Avenue 3rd Floor, El Monte, California and on its website at http://accessla.org. Documents, including Power Point handouts distributed to the committee by staff or committee members at the meeting will simultaneously be made available to the public. Three opportunities are available for the public to address the committee during a committee meeting: (1) before a specific agenized item is debated and voted upon regarding that item and (2) general public comment. The exercise of the right to address the committee is subject to restriction as to time and appropriate decorum. All persons wishing to make public comment must fill out a yellow Public Comment Form and submit it to Access staff. Public comment is generally limited to three (3) minutes per speaker and the total time available for public comment may be limited at the discretion of the Chair. Persons whose speech is impaired such that they are unable to address the committee at a normal rate of speed may request the accommodation of a limited amount of additional time from the Chair but only by checking the appropriate box on the Public Comment Form. Granting such an accommodation is in the discretion of the Chair. The committee will not and cannot respond during the meeting to matters raised under general public comment. Pursuant to provisions of the Brown Act governing these proceedings, no discussion or action may be taken on these matters unless they are listed on the agenda, or unless certain emergency or special circumstances exist. However, the committee may direct staff to investigate and/or schedule certain matters for consideration at a future committee meeting and the staff will respond to all public comment in writing prior to the next meeting.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT

Executive Directors Report

Executive Director, Andre Colaiace provided an update from the FTA. Access is scheduled for a Triennial Review in April 2022.

He also provided an update on the Eligibility center. In-person assessments resumed on December 1st for new customers only.

Mr. Colaiace concluded his report by sharing that Access staff would serve on three Metro taskforces to represent agency and customer interests.

Travel Training Program

Strategic Planner, Eric Haack and Assistant Administrative Analyst, Dina Garcia presented on the Travel Training Program. They discussed ridership data and trends associated with travel trained customers.

Approximately 65% of travel-trained customers use fixed route services for one to three years after their training. Fifty percent of these customers continue to use fixed route services after four to six years. Only 10% of travel trained customers use paratransit services with no fixed route trips. The analysis concluded that travel trained customers use paratransit services on less frequent basis than those who are not trained.

Public Comment:

Fernando Roldan, CALIF Board Member, suggested introducing travel training for boarding Metro Micro buses. He proposed a partnership between Access and Metro to provide discounted fares for riders using the service. He stated it would be easier to use it if he could use his Access card as a form of payment.

Technology Update

Director of Information Technology, Bill Tsuei provided the technology update. Between 2020 and 2021 the agency completed cybersecurity enhancements, underwent a systems backup, and implemented updates to Rider360.

He provided an update on the FTA Mobility for All Grant - Accessible Traveler Mobile App. The 18 month project began in June 2022. Enhancements to the Where's My Ride application will include a mobile ticket and e-wallet, trip planner features and mobile reservations.

Mr. Tsuei concluded his report with an overview of major IT projects. The Trapeze Online Reservation is expected to go live in the Northern and Santa Clarita regions in late February.

Autonomous Vehicle Video

Chief Marketing and Creative Officer, Josh Southwick and Mr. Tsuei co-presented a short video featuring the assembly of Access' autonomous paratransit vehicle. The accessible autonomous vehicle is expected to be available in October 2021 and will be featured in multiple vehicle roadshows.

Parents with Disabilities

Project Administrator, Alex Chrisman, and Eric Haack, provided an update on the Parents with Disabilities Program (PWD). The program is available in all six service areas. As of December 1, 2021, 31 riders are currently eligible for the service. More than 2,000 trips have been completed since its launch in August 2021.

Operations Update

Operations Manager, Rogelio Gomez presented the operations report for October 2021. He presented key performance indicators (KPIs) for each service area. In October, service providers met 11 of the 13 KPIs. He discussed operational challenges and a plan to assist with contractor staffing.

Mr. Gomez concluded his report with an update on LA taxi rules. New regulations allow for light branding on taxi vehicles. The Access logo must still be displayed on the vehicle.

Public Comment:

Fernando Roldan recommended connecting with CALIF to assist with recruitment efforts. He suggested offering a signing bonus for new drivers and staff.
