Note: Access Transportation Professionals Advisory Committee meetings are held pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act [Cal. Gov. Code §54950] and are open to the public. The public may view and obtain all written information supporting this agenda provided to the committee both initially and supplementary prior to the meeting at the agency's offices located at 3449 Santa Anita Avenue 3rd Floor, El Monte, California and on its website at http://accessla.org. Documents, including Power Point handouts distributed to the committee by staff or committee members at the meeting will simultaneously be made available to the public. Three opportunities are available for the public to address the committee during a committee meeting: (1) before a specific agenized item is debated and voted upon regarding that item and (2) general public comment. The exercise of the right to address the committee is subject to restriction as to time and appropriate decorum. All persons wishing to make public comment must fill out a yellow Public Comment Form and submit it to Access staff. Public comment is generally limited to three (3) minutes per speaker and the total time available for public comment may be limited at the discretion of the Chair. Persons whose speech is impaired such that they are unable to address the committee at a normal rate of speed may request the accommodation of a limited amount of additional time from the Chair but only by checking the appropriate box on the Public Comment Form. Granting such an accommodation is in the discretion of the Chair. The committee will not and cannot respond during the meeting to matters raised under general public comment. Pursuant to provisions of the Brown Act governing these proceedings, no discussion or action may be taken on these matters unless they are listed on the agenda, or unless certain emergency or special circumstances exist. However, the committee may direct staff to investigate and/or schedule certain matters for consideration at a future committee meeting and the staff will respond to all public comment in writing prior to the next meeting.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director, Andre Colaiace, announced that Access was embarking on an exciting project. He stated that the main goals when they conducted a comprehensive operation review and adopted the strategic plan, was for the agency to own and manage their own operations and maintenance facilities in the service regions. They are one of the few agencies in Los Angeles County that ask that contractors' lease or own their own facilities. Unfortunately, during bidding for contractors, this reduces potential competition given the scarcity of available land in Los Angeles County. Secondly, there's a risk if one of the contractors were to lose their lease, in their operations and maintenance facility, which could cause substantial operational problems for Access services. They are embarking on a program that will probably take about 10 years. The Access Board approved the purchase of land in Lancaster, California, and the Lancaster City Council approved a disposition and development agreement with Access for the development of a paratransit operations and maintenance facility. They will discuss this further during the January and February Board meeting cycle. They will be looking for opportunities as they present themselves in the Los Angeles basin but are starting their first project in the Antelope Valley. He also stated that Great Blue Research, will be conducting another survey for Access on January 10th. The survey will give Access customers an opportunity to share the different forms of travel they use to get around Los Angeles County. Whether it's with Access, the bus or train, TNCs like Uber or Lyft, your Dial Ride services or other modes like taxi. They are interested in this information because they can use it to further tailor the services to customers. He thinks it will be useful information for Access and other member agencies. They will be presenting the results of that survey to both TPAC, CAC, and the Board of Directors.

2022 JOE KING AWARD RECIPIENT

Manager of Eligibility Karen Gilbert presented this award to recipient Alan Suarez of MTM Transit.

OPERATIONS REPORT

Project Administrator, Jessica Volanos, presented the performance statistics and KPIs. She stated that some of the highlights were that the Board approved the Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan, also known as PTASP for Access, which outlines how the agency will endeavor to maintain a safe environment using the safety management system principles as championed by the federal government. Access began distributing new documents to the contractor called Safety Bulletins at the end

of November, and these are sent out as an as-needed basis when Access or the contractors have identified new safety concerns. Lastly, she added that the contractors promoted safety and driver retention this past holiday season by hosting holiday themed safety campaigns and morale boosting celebrations. She added that Access continued to require a mask aboard its vehicles in keeping with the county's health order, which allows transit agencies to determine their own policy as it relates to the masks.

NEW BUSINESS RAISED SUBSEQUENT TO THE POSTING OF THE AGENDA

Diane Amaya announced that Jesse Valdez would be departing for his new life in retirement. She congratulated Jesse for all his years of dedication and serving in many prior years for a long time as a TPAC Chair.

Jesse Valdez thanked everyone and said he will miss serving with the fellow TPAC members. He has seen so many positive changes Access has made and appreciates all the changes that Andre Colaiace has made.

Gracie Davis thanked Jesse for all his contributions to TPAC and stated that he will be missed. She encouraged him to keep in touch with them.
