Note: Access Transportation Professionals Advisory Committee meetings are held pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act [Cal. Gov. Code §54950] and are open to the public. The public may view and obtain all written information supporting this agenda provided to the committee both initially and supplementary prior to the meeting at the agency's offices located at 3449 Santa Anita Avenue 3rd Floor, El Monte, California and on its website at <http://accessla.org>. Documents, including Power Point handouts distributed to the committee by staff or committee members at the meeting will simultaneously be made available to the public. Three opportunities are available for the public to address the committee during a committee meeting: (1) before a specific agenzized item is debated and voted upon regarding that item and (2) general public comment. The exercise of the right to address the committee is subject to restriction as to time and appropriate decorum. All persons wishing to make public comment must fill out a yellow Public Comment Form and submit it to Access staff. Public comment is generally limited to three (3) minutes per speaker and the total time available for public comment may be limited to the discretion of the Chair. Persons whose speech is impaired such that they are unable to address the committee at a normal rate of speed may request the accommodation of a limited amount of additional time from the Chair but only by checking the appropriate box on the Public Comment Form. Granting such an accommodation is in the discretion of the Chair. The committee will not and cannot respond during the meeting to matters raised under general public comment. Pursuant to provisions of the Brown Act governing these proceedings, no discussion or action may be taken on these matters unless they are listed on the agenda, or unless certain emergency or special circumstances exist. However, the committee may direct staff to investigate and/or schedule certain matters for consideration at a future committee meeting and the staff will respond to all public comment in writing prior to the next meeting.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director, Andre Colaiace stated that the Abilities Expo was held this past weekend at the Los Angeles Convention Center. It was one of their biggest trip generators during the year in terms of special events. He thanked everyone for attending the event that weekend and representing Access at the Abilities Expo. He reminded them that the regional community meeting was going to be held on Saturday, March 15th. It's a great opportunity for customers to hear the latest about

Access and receive personalized assistance if they're having any issues. He thanked Randy Johnson and the Access team for putting it together. A few weeks ago, he made a presentation to Metro's Finance Budget and Audit Committee about Access. He gave a mid-year operational financial update and then answered questions from the committee. There's a lot of interest on that committee, particularly because it's comprised of the Board of Supervisors, Horvath and Barger about the emergency response to the recent wildfires. Overall, the presentation went well, the committee members were complimentary of their efforts and look forward to working with them on regional emergency response issues moving forward. He gave an update on the status of the flex pilot program. It was a program in the southern region that was designed to integrate Uber and potentially Lyft and other TNCs into the next state paratransit services to try and use them similar to the use of taxis. They are suspending the program for a number of different reasons. They were never able to attain critical mass in terms of trip usage by the southern region contractor. The biggest factors was the regulatory uncertainty that surrounds these types of programs. TNCs like Uber and Lyft do not have drug and alcohol testing, which is a federal requirement. However, in late December, the Federal Transit Administration promulgated revisions to its guidance suggesting that it's not. They learned a lot of things about how best to run this type of program and there is a positive that came out of it. They used the fare payment system that was programmed into the Where's My Ride app, to have customers who are using the flex program pay fares and it is going to be expanded to the rest of the customers at some point in the future.

MOBILE TICKETING

Bill Tsuei and Thomas Lee gave a presentation on the Where's My Ride statistics and the mobile ticketing. They have a new version of a Where's My Ride Smartphone app that was released to public on July 3rd, 2023. The online reservation made from the smartphone app has increased from 5% to 10% over a year. Basically over 10% of the trips are made by the Where's My Ride app and at the same time, the web booking, the online reservation made by the web application remains at about 10%. They still have the current web online reservation and have created another button as well. Additionally, they also have the Rider to Driver communication feature available now.

MEMBER DISCUSSION

Chair Ishaq asked if in regard to the web online booking, it's available in the Northern region. Thomas Lee responded that it wasn't available for the Santa Clarita region. It supports all other regions, though.

David Feinberg asked if that has to do with the different software packages that are running in those areas. They currently have a philosophy of where the contractors bring their own software. They have 5M in most regions, but then Trapeze and the Northern and Santa Clarita regions. He asked if the version of trapeze in Santa Clarita is different than the version in Northern Regions. Bill Tsuei responded that they have recently updated to the same version, but Santa Clarita is currently in process of transition from Trapeze to a different software called Spare. That's why they haven't enabled the online reservation in that region, but they will do so after the transition to the new software.

CTSA E-BOOK

CTSA analyst Mayra Noriega gave this presentation. She stated the Consolidated Transportation Services Agency for Los Angeles County; Access Services seeks to foster and promote coordination among public transit operators and existing social service transportation providers. Their mission is to connect transportation professionals with health and human service representatives to bridge transit needs throughout LA County. To accomplish this, CTSA extension provides its network with diverse opportunities for across industry collaboration. The agency offers specialized trainings and workshops designed to enhance professional skills and knowledge essential to delivering safe and effective transit and paratransit services. CTSA extension trainings are available both in person at the headquarters office or online on a virtual platform. The course catalog is accessible annually through the learning and development eBook, which is posted on the Access website. These classes are subsidized by the agency and are typically offered at no cost to attendees.

OPERATIONS REPORT

Garrett Rodriguez presented the statistics for operations and gave some highlights. He stated the operations team continued community outreach efforts in February with visits to the following, Forever Young Adult Day Healthcare in Baldwin Park, Sunny Day Adult Day Healthcare in El Monte, Star Adult Day Healthcare in El Monte as well, Antelope Valley College in Lancaster, Central Adult Day Healthcare Center in Los Angeles and lastly, Robertson Adult Day Healthcare Center in Beverly Hills. The Abilities Expo took place at the Los Angeles Convention Center March 7th through the 9th where Access facilitated over 700 trips. Access and contractor staff ensured smooth transportation and staffed the Access booth to engage with participants and answer questions.

Matthew Avancena reported that Ms. Silva Baghdanian from the Glendale Beeline and David Feinberg from the Santa Monica Big Blue Bus, volunteered to serve on the nomination subcommittee. He is pleased to report that Fayma Ishaq is willing to serve another term as the TPAC Chair and David Feinberg from Santa Monica, Big Blue Bus was gracious enough to also volunteer to serve as the TPAC Vice Chair. He will form a

nominating committee in a couple of months so that they can have elections for the FY '25-26 fiscal year. With that information, he asked they vote to elect Fayma Ishaq as the Chair and David Feinberg as Vice Chair.
