Note: Access Transportation Professionals Advisory Committee meetings are held pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act [Cal. Gov. Code §54950] and are open to the public. The public may view and obtain all written information supporting this agenda provided to the committee both initially and supplementary prior to the meeting at the agency's offices located at 3449 Santa Anita Avenue 3rd Floor, El Monte, California and on its website at http://accessla.org. Documents, including Power Point handouts distributed to the committee by staff or committee members at the meeting will simultaneously be made available to the public. Three opportunities are available for the public to address the committee during a committee meeting: (1) before a specific agenized item is debated and voted upon regarding that item and (2) general public comment. The exercise of the right to address the committee is subject to restriction as to time and appropriate decorum. All persons wishing to make public comment must fill out a yellow Public Comment Form and submit it to Access staff. Public comment is generally limited to three (3) minutes per speaker and the total time available for public comment may be limited at the discretion of the Chair. Persons whose speech is impaired such that they are unable to address the committee at a normal rate of speed may request the accommodation of a limited amount of additional time from the Chair but only by checking the appropriate box on the Public Comment Form. Granting such an accommodation is in the discretion of the Chair. The committee will not and cannot respond during the meeting to matters raised under general public comment. Pursuant to provisions of the Brown Act governing these proceedings, no discussion or action may be taken on these matters unless they are listed on the agenda, or unless certain emergency or special circumstances exist. However, the committee may direct staff to investigate and/or schedule certain matters for consideration at a future committee meeting and the staff will respond to all public comment in writing prior to the next meeting.

APPROVE APRIL 8, 2021 MEETING MINUTES

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director of Planning and Coordination, Matthew Avancena, provided the Executive Director's report. Access staff assisted the City of Santa Monica and LA METRO with the ADA portion of their Triennial Reviews. There were no ADA Paratransit findings for both reviews.

Mr. Avancena also noted that the Parents with Disabilities program would restart in August. He concluded his report with an update on Rider 360 2.0. The database was migrated to a cloud-based service that complies with federal and state regulations.

FY 2022 BUDGET

Deputy Executive Director, Hector Rodriguez, provided a comprehensive overview of the budget process for fiscal year 2022. He detailed key operating expenses and highlighted major changes in the budget forecast. Purchase transportation and eligibility expenses account for the biggest increases in the budget. Additionally, there are challenges with acquiring vehicles in the current market, therefore capital costs will roll over to the 2022 budget. Lastly, staff is proposing the addition of four new full-time employee positions for the agency. Mr. Rodriguez concluded his presentation with a summary of the timeline for implementing a new MOU with L.A. METRO.

WHERES MY RIDE APP DEVELOPMENTS

IT Project Manager, Thomas Lee, provided an update on the Where's My Ride application. The new app features enhanced visual elements for an improved user-interface. It includes functions for vehicle tracking and driver to rider communications. The app will be tested among a small group of riders during a pilot deployment.

OPERATIONS UPDATE

Operations Manager, Rogelio Gomez, presented the operations report for April 2021. Ridership demand surged in early April and adversely affected key performance indicators (KPIs) for the month. Mr. Gomez discussed elements of the COVID-19 service restoration plan that were implemented to reduce stress on the system. Preliminary data for May indicates that the response effectively improved KPI performance.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT UPDATE

Emergency Management Coordinator, Matthew Topoozian, presented the COVID-19 operations report. On April 30th Access concluded its delivery operations. In total, Access delivered over 438,000 meals, groceries, and paper goods to seniors and people with disabilities across Los Angeles County. On May 1st, Access reinstated full-shared rides and ended the same day service pilot program. Service changes were posted on the Access website, the Where's My Ride application and a number of other communication platforms. On May 28th Access fully demobilized the Emergency

Operations Center. Mr. Topoozian concluded his report with an update on ridership levels.

CTSA EXTENSION PROGRAM

CTSA Analyst, Melissa Lucero, presented an overview of the agency's CTSA Extension program. She provided an update on the Learning & Development program and highlighted upcoming training opportunities for the remainder of the year. Ms. Lucero also shared information regarding the 2021 Joe King Memorial Scholarship.

OFFICER NOMINATING SUBCOMITTEE

Director of Planning and Coordination, Matthew Avancena, discussed the upcoming TPAC officer elections. Kevin Parks McDonald and Martin Tompkins volunteered to serve on the Officer Nomination Subcommittee.

NEW BUSINESS RAISED SUBSEQUENT TO THE POSTING OF THE AGENDA

RE: TPAC OFFICER ELECTIONS FY 2021-2022

ISSUE:

In accordance with Transportation Professionals Advisory Committee Bylaws, it is necessary to elect new officers for TPAC for Fiscal Year 2021-2022.

RECOMMENDATION:

Elect Diane Amaya from Beach Cities Transit (City of Redondo Beach) as chairperson and Fayma Ishaq from L.A. Metro as vice-chair.

BACKGROUND:

The TPAC bylaws require that officer elections take place for the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson to fill 12-month terms effective September 2021 through October 2022.

Staff notified TPAC members of the need to hold elections at the June 2021 meeting and requested volunteers to serve on the nominating subcommittee. Kevin Parks McDonald (Foothill Transit) and Martin Tompkins (Antelope Valley Transit Authority) volunteered to serve on the nominating committee.

Attached are the relevant portions of the TPAC Bylaws that address officer elections:

Article 5 - Officers

Committee members will recommend a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson for consideration by the Board Chair. If ratified by the Board Chair, the term is one year from September through October.

Officers will be elected every year at the August meeting by a ROLL CALL VOICE VOTE of the majority of the members present. Officer seats will be limited to two consecutive terms served by any one individual, subject to Board chair ratification.

Duties of the Chairperson

The Chairperson will preside at the meetings and will represent the Committee at meetings of the Access Services Board of Directors and Board committees, when appropriate.

<u>Duties of the Vice Chairperson</u>

The Vice-Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson.

Vacancies of Officer Positions

A vacancy of an officer position shall exist in the following circumstances:

- (a) the resignation or death of an officer;
- (b) the removal of an officer by a ROLL CALL VOICE VOTE of the majority of the Committee;
- (c) the removal of an officer as a member of the Committee by the Board of Directors as provided in Article 3 of these bylaws.

Filling Vacancies of Officer Positions

Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, vacancies of an Officer position shall be filled by approval of the affirmative ROLL CALL VOICE VOTE of the members present at a regularly scheduled or special meeting held pursuant to Article 7 of these bylaws. Access staff will provide nominations to the Board of Directors. One (1) or more individuals may be nominated for any Committee vacancy.

In the event of a vacancy of the officer position of Chair, the presiding Vice-Chair officer will automatically assume the role of Chair for the remaining term. There will then be an election conducted for the Vice-Chair position by approval of the affirmative ROLL CALL VOICE VOTE of members present at a regularly scheduled or special meeting held pursuant to Article 7 of these bylaws.
